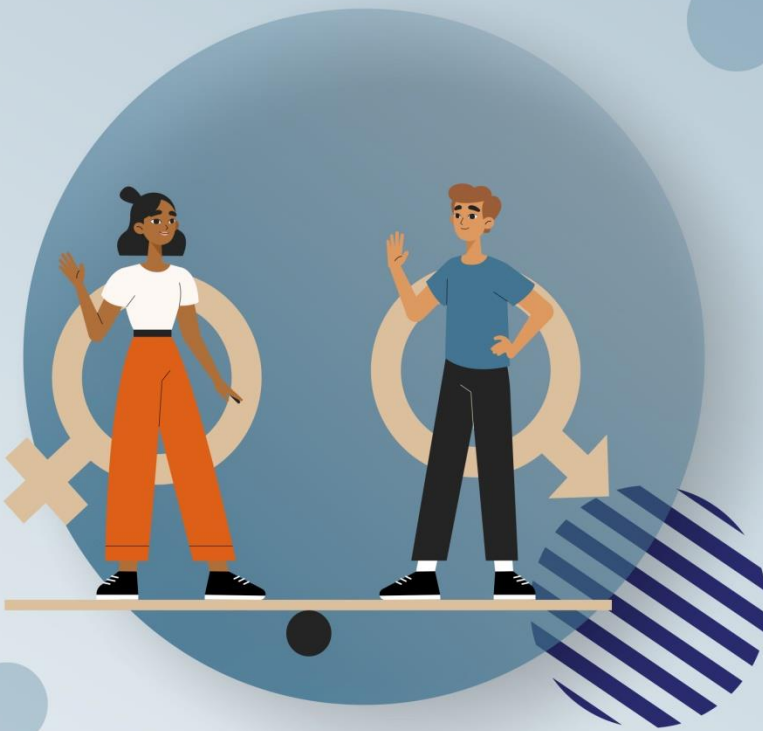

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

"MoveON - Moving Towards Gender Sensitive Youth Work in Europe" is a long term project which envisages 2 activities - a Training Course for Youth Workers and a Youth Exchange for Young People.

Both activities will be targeting youth workers and young people based in the countries of the European Union (Sweden, Bulgaria, Cyprus and Greece) and the Neighboring countries (Armenia, Belarus, Georgia and Ukraine).

The long term project **"MoveON - Moving Towards Gender Sensitive Youth Work in Europe"** aims at increasing the awareness of youth workers, youth leaders and young people about gender perspectives and challenges in Europe, providing participants with skills to develop good quality projects and non-formal activities locally and internationally under the Erasmus+. Through the project, partner organizations would like to tackle gender issues and look for solutions which can be adapted to their organizations as well as societies and daily lives. The project aims to develop and improve the knowledge and understanding of youth workers involved in the project on various gender-related concepts, analyze traditions, roles and perceptions of gender in different European countries and societies.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

The project pursues the following objectives:

- A) Exchanging experiences, best practices and knowledge between youth workers and youth organizations on gender mainstreaming and women empowerment;
- B) Developing participant's knowledge and understanding of various concepts related to gender and emphasizing the importance of gender equality in youth work;
- C) Providing space for learning about gender issues by sharing and comparing the realities in the European Union and the Neighboring Partner countries;
- D) Promoting gender sensitivity in youth work and gender-sensitive approach in the participating organizations;
- E) Facilitating networking among participants and promoting development of joint projects under Erasmus+ promoting gender equality;
- F) Developing quality support systems for youth activities and capacities of youth organizations to develop partnerships.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

While planning their trip to Armenia, the participants are recommended to reach Yerevan through 2 airports: **Yerevan International Airport (Armenia)** and **Gyumri Airport (Armenia)**. Now many low-cost companies fly to Armenia. Budget carriers **Eurowings**, **SkyUp airlines**, **Bees Airlines** and **WizzAir** entered the Armenian market. You can to the capital Yerevan and the city of Gyumri.

The participants landing in Yerevan or Gyumri will be picked up by the organizers.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE INFORMATION

The project will take place from **13th to 21st of November, 2021**. The **13th** of November is an **Arrival Day**. Make sure you arrive at the hotel between 12:00 to 18:00. We will have a welcome dinner all together at 19:00. The official program starts on the **14th** of November.

21st of November is a **Departure Day**. Check out should be performed after breakfast.

NOTE! You can arrive in Yerevan a couple of days earlier or stay a couple of days longer to see around or to travel a bit. However, this should be done at your own expense. The Hosting organization can help you to find a hostel for extra days, but you should bear those extra costs.

TICKETS AND REGISTRATION

You should make a small research and purchase the cheapest tickets. The **deadline** to purchase the tickets is **20th of October**.

NOTE! The ticket should be consulted with us before you buy it. You should consult the tickets with the Project Manager, Mrs. Diana Babakhanyan - dianababakhanyan@apy.am. She will help you to find the best option. Only after the confirmation, the ticket can be purchased.

Once the participants buy the tickets, they will be asked to fill in an **online Registration Form** till **5th of November**. This will help the organizing team to develop the program that meets the expectations of the participants!

THE PROFILE OF THE PARTICIPANTS

Youth Exchange is intended for **young people** aged **18-25** who are personally interested in the topic of **gender equality**, are motivated to take active part in the project and share the experience gained during the project in their communities.

The Youth Exchange will engage **12** young people with fewer opportunities aged between 18-25 from **Armenia, Belarus, Cyprus, Greece, Georgia** and **Sweden**. The results of our own observations show that young people with fewer opportunities benefit greatly from international youth projects and it is very important to engage young people who live in deprived and often hostile communities.

Each partner organization of the project will be responsible for the selection of participants.

A special attention will be paid to follow-up activities proposed by the young people. This will be one of the main selection criteria because it will be better if the participants of the Exchange will be ready to commit not only to the project but also to organizing follow up activities. Each group will have 1 Group Leader who is experienced in working with young people and facilitating youth groups.

We will keep the **gender balance** in the groups and invite equal number of male and female participants. All the planned activities are based on gender mainstreaming and consider special needs of young people.

To ensure successful implementation of follow-up activities the hosting and applicant organizations together with all project partners and Group Leaders will **mentor** the participants for at least **3 months** after the end of the project.

VISA INFORMATION

Members stated of the EU and Eastern Partnership do not need visa to enter Armenia. Armenia has a **visa-free** regime with all the countries of the EU and Eastern Partnership. In case you arrive to airport in Georgia, it also has a visa-free regime with the EU and EaP.

FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

100% of the total travel expenses will be reimbursed.

Reimbursement will be done in EUR, regardless of the currency indicated on the ticket and receipt/invoice. Any tickets purchased in a local currency other than EUR, will then be converted and calculated according to the exchange rate of the month given by the European Commission.

NOTE! Please check travel budget limits above. If travel costs exceed the amount budgeted in the project, the organizers will only be able to reimburse participants the maximum travel costs indicated in the travel budget. You are therefore strongly advised to consult the tickets with us and book your flights well in advance.

IMPORTANT! According to sustainability policy of the organizers, only the tickets that are bought around 1 month before the activity starts can be reimbursed. This means that the deadline to consult us and have your ticket purchased in 20th of October.

Reimbursement: All the participants will receive the travel reimbursement through a bank transfer.

IMPORTANT! In order to receive the travel reimbursement, every participant should attach the following documents to the reimbursement form:

- **Tickets** (there must be price and name of the person stated on it).
- **Boarding passes** (in case of loss – please get a confirmation from the airlines, that the flight was taken)
- **Invoices** – yes, even if you have a ticket, our accounting still needs an INVOICE.
- **Online Check-in** should be made before your leave Yerevan to make sure you give as Boarding Passes from the way back as well.

COVID-19 Measures

Please check the following travel restrictions before your trip:

- Upon entering the territory of the Republic of Armenia via air and land borders travelers will be asked to provide a **COVID-19 PCR test** certificate with negative results taken within the previous **72 hours**.
- The PCR certificate should be in Armenian, Russian or English, include the name, surname, date of birth, and passport number of the examined person, printed on the official letterhead of the medical institution conducting the test, identifying all contacts of the organization, test result signed and sealed by the head of the medical institution.
- In case the participant is fully vaccinated, no PCR test is required in Armenia. The participant needs to show the **vaccination certificate** upon arrival. The certificate should be in English, printed on the official letterhead, and should contain the following information:
 1. all contacts and the name of the head of the medical institution where the vaccination was taken,
 2. the name, surname, date of birth, and passport number of the vaccinated person,
 3. the vaccine manufacturing name and the product's serial number, the dates of the first and the second dosages, signed by the head of the medical institution with its seal.

Safety measures during the Training Course:

- We will make sure that the common areas at the hotel have hand sanitizer and water dispensers;
- We will open the windows every 15 minutes to let the fresh air in the room;
- We will have the thermometers, face masks and sanitizers at the hotel; We will replace the activities that include hugging and physical contact.

INSURANCE

Please keep in mind that you are self-responsible for sufficient insurance (illness/personal liability/cancellation/theft etc.).

Hosting organization takes **no responsibility** for the individual insurance. Make sure you have a travel insurance valid in Armenia from **13th to 21st** of **November**.

ACCOMMODATION

During the Youth Exchange, the participants will be accommodated in double or triple rooms in a hotel.

The name and the address of the hotel will be communicated to the selected participants. Two or three participants will share a room with a private bathroom.

The hotel will provide all the necessary supplies for participants' comfortable stay – towels, certain amenities, as well as free Wi-Fi.

During all the activities, food will be prepared by experienced cooks, provided at the venue. Three meals and two coffee breaks per day will be provided. The participants will inform the organizers about their dietary needs (vegetarian, vegan, halal food, allergies) in the application form, so the staff can arrange the menu according to their needs.

Moreover, the participants will have an opportunity to get to know the local cuisine of Armenia and the traditions of all the participating countries.

INTERCULTURAL EVENING

During a special evening we will share characteristics from our culture. We ask you to bring foods and **non-alcoholic** drinks to share! You can also think of some other things to share with the group from your culture: stories, dances / songs etc. Just no power point presentation or country promotion videos, as it would be the best if you can share something in your own words! By the way, to present something from your culture does not mean it has to be something from your country: it can also be from a region, a city etc.

NGO FAIR

One of the aims of the project is to develop cooperation and new projects between the NGO's. That is why we are going to organize an **NGO fair** where every organization will have a chance to **present** itself. Make sure you bring some informational materials, flyers, booklets or publications representing your organization.

YOUTHPASS CERTIFICATES

All participants will receive a **YouthPass certificate** in the end of the project. Upon their request participants will get also Annex to Youth Pass with 8 Key Competences.

LANGUAGE

The language of the course is **English**.

DEADLINES

15th October – The participants are chosen by the sending organizations.

20th October – The tickets are bought by the participants.

5th November – The Registration Forms are submitted by the participants.

10th November – The arrival list and the airport pick up information is sent to the participants.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Weather in Armenia

The average maximum daytime temperature lies around 11.0°C (51.8°F). Bring a thick blanket because during the night it can cool down to temperatures below freezing. Plan on layering your clothes. Some days or part of the day it will be nice and warm and some moments it can be a bit chilly. Bring a rain jacket just in case since it will be raining a few days during this period. Also bring some warm clothes.

Currency in Armenia

Armenian national currency is the Dram (AMD). There are ATM machines and banks all around the city. Payments with VISA/Master Card credit cards are possible in most of the supermarkets, cafes, shops and restaurants.

THE ORGANIZERS



Armenian Progressive Youth (APY) was founded in Yerevan, Armenia in 2009 by a group of young people. Today it grew up into a big organization which counts many local and international volunteers, hundreds of members and followers, thousands of direct and indirect beneficiaries from Armenia and all over Europe. Armenian Progressive Youth NGO (APY) has been working with young people since for 10 years.
